<p>Each year thereafter for your dog's lifetime, it will need yearly boosters on its vaccinations, as well as a yearly deworming.</p>		<p>Walk ins for vaccinations are always welcome. Spay and Neuter Surgeries are done daily by appointment.</p>		

The Puppy Vaccination (DHPP), also known as a distemper-parvo shot, is one injection that protects your dog against the serious and often fatal diseases, distemper, hepatitis, parvovirus, and parainfluenza. As shown in the above recommended schedule, puppies require a series of injections beginning at 6-8 weeks of age and continuing every 4 weeks until puppy is 16 weeks of age to ensure that they develop a protective immunity. Adult dogs are susceptible to these diseases as well and to maintain their immunity they require a yearly booster.

The Bordetella Vaccination (Kennel Cough) is an oral/nasal/injection that protects your dog against the aerosolized virus bordetella. As shown in the above recommended schedule, puppies need to receive this intranasal dose once at about 8 weeks. An annual booster is needed each and every year thereafter to maintain protection. We recommend boosting every 6 months if exposure to other dogs is high: grooming, boarding, dog parks, parks etc.

The Rabies Vaccination is an injection that protects your dog against the fatal disease rabies. This vaccination is required by law as humans can contract rabies. Your dog will need an initial injection at 12 weeks, a **booster one year from the initial**, and thereafter every other year for his or her life.

HEARTWORM PREVENTION in Wyoming, is recommended May thru October each year. Our doctors advise the use of Tri-Heart Plus as a monthly treatment during the mosquito season, to prevent your dog from becoming infected with heartworms. If your dog was not on heartworm prevention medication during the previous year, we strongly recommend a blood test be done before treatment with Tri-Heart Plus.
